The Department of Social Sciences and the Postgraduate Secretariat of the National University of Quilmes invites researchers, professionals, teachers, students and the general public to participate in the I INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE OF PUBLIC HISTORY AND DIVULGATION: Issues, actors and social divulgation of history and the FESTIVAL: History a public good, to be held between 22nd and 24th May, 2023 at the National University of Quilmes.

As a starting point for debate, we call for reflection about Public History, it's narratives, how are they produced, their forms, it's circulation, and which meanings it grants for broad sectors of society. The meeting also hosts experiences on the ways of divulgating academic advances to the general public, as well as the various ways in which history is expressed in communities: orally, in memory sites, in museums, theatrical and musical performances, editorial collections, cinema, television, new screens, archives, and different expressions of literature and the visual arts; that is why together with the realization of a Conference, we will celebrate an open Festival that summons the arts and disciplines that contribute to the social construction of historical consciousness.

About the Dynamics of the Conference

The Conference proposes multiple spaces for reflection and debate about Public History and divulgation (Conferences, Thematic Tables, Round Tables and Conversations) along with the development of activities in the Festival: History as a public good. Thus, international specialists will be in charge of the opening Conference, dictated by Dr. Thomas Cauvin; the opening panel of the second day, will be shared by the Dr. Juniele Rabêlo de Almeida, Dr. Michel Koblinsky and Dr. Jimena Perry and will cover the challenges of Public History in Latin America; and, the third day panel will be dedicated to the public Communication of Science with Argentine historians and will be chaired by Dr. Gabriel Di Meglio and coordinated by Dr. Pablo Esteban, head of the Scientific News Agency of the UNQ and Alejandra F Rodriguez, director of the Master in Public History and Divulgation of History.

The meeting will have Work Tables, where coordinated presentations will be presented by renowned researchers, who will give feedback on the work and will raise topics for discussion. Each table will have a coordinator and a rapporteur; 15 minutes will be allocated for the presentation of each work, 15 minutes for rapporteurship and 20 minutes for discussion and questions.

The following thematic axes are proposed in order to articulate the presentations:

- 1. Public history, memories and oral sources
- **2.** Uses of history, politics and contemporary debates
- **3.** The writing and edition of divulgated history
- **4.** Audiovisual production and divulgated history
- 5. Museums, public history and communities
- 6. Public history, photography and communities
- 7. Issues of public history, archives and documentation centers
- 8. Historical tourism, historical heritage and market
- 9. Radio, podcast and new ways to do history
- **10.** Public history and school history: knowledge, actors and experiences
- 11. To play and interact with history: video games, board games and apps
- **12.** The gender of history: women and dissidence in the process of constructing memories
- 13. Public history and the transmission of processes of health and diseases
- **14.** Joint models between academic history and other knowledge and professional practices
- 15. Experiences of artistic creation in archives
- **16.** 40 years of democracy: transformations in the ways of doing history in Argentina

Round tables and talks:

- Convergences between Cinema and History
- Tangled history: with the presence of historians who divulgate content through networks
- The making of public historians. experiences and challenges
- The Public and the Private: Women's Narratives of History (Brazil and Argentina)
- History through the theatrical event.

Within the framework of the Festival, History a public good, the following activities open to the community will be carried out:

- Radio and podcast workshops with historical content, coordinated by Radio UNQ
- Board games workshop of historical topics
- Plays and musical shows
- Photograph exhibition
- Visits to museums and memory sites

Work tables presentation:

- Rationale of the topic: Up to 500 words in Times New Roman font 12, space
 1.5
- Bibliography (3 or 4 authors as reference)
- Topic for which it is proposed
- Title
- Surname and Name/Institutional Affiliation/Email
- Rapporteurs/commentators (maximum 2)
- The abstracts of the participants must be sent.
- The proposed work tables may be expanded with new abstracts that are presented to the different axes.

Abstract presentation:

The content must include:

- Topic for which it is proposed
- Title
- Surname and Name/Institutional Affiliation/Email
- Rationale of the topic Hypothesis of the work/ In the case of an experience, include a description.
- Stage of development. Bibliography (3 or 4 authors
- as reference).
- Up to 800 words in Times New Roman font 12, space 1.5.

The abstracts presented will be evaluated by the Scientific Committee that will communicate by email the acceptance or rejection of the proposals, after which each participant must register for the Conference.

Once the proposals are accepted, the complete papers, by those who wish to be published in the record, must be uploaded to the page before 2nd May, 2023.
